Loneliness is one of those concepts we assume we know. We equate it to the very definable concept of being alone, which means "without other people", and thanks to "lonely people" archetypes — like the spinster with 10 cats and the misunderstood teenager — we think we know exactly what loneliness looks like. The trouble is, loneliness is actually subjective (i.e. different from person to person), so there's no way anyone can truly know what it looks like.
