To be eligible for WIC in Wisconsin, a person must meet the following requirements:

- You are pregnant, breastfeeding or a new mother and/or have an infant or children under 5 years of age,
- You or your child has a health or nutrition need (note: screening is done at your certification appointment), **and**
- You meet the following income guidelines:


