

Program Highlights

- The STAR team received the Martin Luther King Jr., Educator Award for its work to educate students in the spirit of Dr. King.
- The Boys & Girls Clubs of the Fox Valley's Youth of the Year honor was awarded to Appleton North STAR Scholar, Bradon Wiggins.
- STAR was one of only 100 causes throughout the country that was voted to receive a \$25,000 State Farm Neighborhood Assist® grant.
